INCIDENT TYPE – WEAPONS ON CAMPUS / EDUCATIONAL PROPERTY

HIGH POINT, NC – On Tuesday, August 27, 2019 the High Point Police Department was contacted by High Point University who advised that their security officers were in contact with a student in his dorm room that was in possession of two firearms as well as ammunition. Arriving officers responded to the dorm room, observed and seized the firearms and took the student, identified as **Paul A Steber W/M 19 a freshman from Boston, Massachusetts**, into custody and transported him to the High Point Police Department for questioning.

Steber was charged with two Felony counts of Weapons on Campus or Other Educational Property (Class F Felony). He was confined to the Guilford County (High Point) Jail under a two-million dollar secure bond. Through the course of the investigation, detectives developed probable cause to charge Steber with one count of Communicating a Threat of Mass Violence on Educational Property (Class H Felony). The bond for the third charge was set at one-million dollars.

This incident is still under investigation and for that reason no investigative details will be released. The High Point Police Department will continue to work with officials from High Point University; however, at this time there are no indications of additional threats.
