SISTERS IN CRIME ANNIVERSARY PARTY COMES TO HIGH POINT PUBLIC LIBRARY

Author Panel and Individual Writing Consultations on September 17

HIGH POINT, N.C. (August 29, 2017) – The Triad NC chapter of Sisters in Crime, a national women-centered organization of mystery authors, will celebrate the organization’s 30th anniversary at the High Point Public Library from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 17. The event, one of many celebrations throughout the U.S. and Canada, will feature a panel discussion with local mystery novelists, free writing consultations for aspiring authors and a book signing.

Sisters in Crime, made up of 50 international chapters, was established to promote the ongoing advancement, recognition and professional development of women crime writers. The Triad NC chapter—formed in 2003 with the name “Murder We Write”—provides numerous professional development resources to local authors, including a monthly program at the High Point Public Library that addresses all aspects of the writers’ life.

The keynote panel discussion, titled “Love, Death, & Money: Writing and Marketing Romantic Suspense and Cozy Mysteries,” will take place from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m., featuring local authors Victoria Gilbert, Jane Tesh and Lynette Hampton (who writes under the name Agnes Alexander). These three authors, along with other Sisters in Crime authors, will hold a book signing afterward, with books available for purchase.

Throughout the event, writers and non-acquiring editors will also offer free 15-minute consultations on the craft and business of writing; attendees will also receive complimentary cake and lemonade.
