HIGH POINT PUBLIC LIBRARY PARKING LOT RENOVATION UPDATE

HIGH POINT, N.C. (November 2, 2017) – As the Library Plaza Project continues, construction crews are now working in the area directly in front of the Library, which has necessitated closing the pathway that led to the front door from the center parking lot. Customers are now directed to enter the front door by taking the Main Street sidewalk and following the constructed path that leads from the sidewalk to the Library entrance.

Customers will continue to access parking from North Elm Street near Dummit Fraden Law Firm and from North Main Street next to Krispy Kreme.

The drive-through window and book drops are closed during this portion of the construction, so customers may continue to return materials and pick up arrived holds inside the building. However, customers may also pick up arrived holds in the Library's rear parking lot at the Mobile Library on weekdays from 1:00 – 4:00 p.m. by calling 336.883.3662 at least one hour prior to the time they plan to arrive. Items may be returned at the Mobile Library as well.

The Library continues to offer holds pick up and materials return at two remote locations: the Parks & Recreation Administration Office at 136 Northpoint Avenue on Monday – Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. and at the Deep River Recreation Center at 1529 Skeet Club Road on Monday – Friday from 5:00 – 8:00 p.m. Materials may also be returned to the High Point Museum at 1859 E. Lexington Avenue on Tuesday – Saturday from 10:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., but holds pick up is not available at the Museum.
